

VT Act 76 Leads to Jump in Loan Fund's Early Care & Learning Lending



Act 76, Vermont's historic Child Care Bill, was enacted last year to increase affordability and access to early care & learning (ECL) programs throughout the state. Since the bill's June 2023 passage, the Loan Fund has seen a dramatic rise in the number of applications for ECL loans, said Vermont Community Loan Fund Executive Director Will Belongia.

"There's been significantly increased interest from Vermont's ECL programs and providers for VCLF financing the expansion of existing programs, and for startup of several new programs," Belongia said.

Recent VCLF ECL loans have supported the construction of new facilities, real estate purchase for facility development, additions and expansions to existing structures, funding staff additions, equipment and fit-up costs and more. In the first half of 2024, the Loan Fund's ECL lending reached \$1.47 million, compared with \$104,500 for the first half of 2023, just prior to Act 76's passage.

"With Act 76's increases in state reimbursements, plus changes making more families eligible for assistance, Vermont's ECL sector and programs are able to grow," said VCLF Director of Business and Early Care & Learning Programs Dan Winslow. "The Loan Fund is committed to helping build capacity and access that Act 76 is making possible, and that Vermont's families need."
